
MEET THE VOLUNTEERS



IN DECEMBER OF 2024 AND JANUARY OF 2025...

WCJC volunteers attended 38 panels, serving their community with more than 100 hours.

Checklist To Drive:

- 1. Are you breathing heavily?
- 2. Are you able to hear or feel your heartbeat in your head?
- 3. Is anything currently making you angry or emotional making you unable to be safe?
- 4. Is your phone giving you notifications and in plain sight?
- 5. Is anything else distracting you from being a safe driver?

If ALL answers to the questions above are no, you are safe to drive again, if not, repeat cooldown and relaxation steps until all above questions are answered truthfully with no.

Finally, be safe and really understand the risks if you are unable to do so.
